Qualifications to Vote in the Election (from the New Castle City Charter):

At any municipal election of the City of New Castle all individuals who shall have attained the age of eighteen 18 at the time of the election who shall have been a resident of the City of New Castle for thirty 30 days preceding said election shall be entitled to vote provided however that said person is otherwise qualified to register to vote *and has registered to vote as required by the Election Laws of the State of Delaware 15 Del C Chapter 75 five <u>5 days prior to said election</u>. The Board of Elections shall decide on the legality of the votes offered.
