

Does Delaware have a photo ID law

We have been receiving many phone calls regarding Delaware's voter identification laws. Delaware does not have a photo identification law. When you arrive at the polling place, you will be asked to show identification. If your name is on the poll list and you do not have identification with you, you may sign an affidavit affirming your identity.

If your name is not on the poll list, the Election Officer will contact the Dept. of Elections to confirm your registration and determine your correct polling place. If your address has changed, the Election Officer will direct you to the correct polling place where you may update your records and vote.



You should have received your new polling place card in the mail. Your polling place may have changed following redistricting -- check your card.
